



BIKING

Ride the waves of the land and history itself on two wheels. The wheat fields offer scenic routes that wind through uncrowded roads, offering a serene escape. For the adventurous, the Echo Red to Red XC race challenges bikers on 25 miles of single-track weaving through the farmland hills. For the thrill-seeker, the Pendleton Adventure Trail Recreation Area (PATRA) near the Eastern Oregon Regional Airport, boasts 16 miles of trails that range from easy to exhilarating. FRISBEE GOLF

Embrace the great outdoors with a twist – conquer the 18-hole disc golf course at Community Park. Push your limits as you navigate rough terrain on the second 9 holes. Don't have discs? No worries! Rent them at the Pendleton Parks & Rec office: (541) 276-8100.

GOLF

Swing into a realm of beauty and challenge. Just 8 miles south of town, the Golf Course at Birch Creek spans the Birch Creek Valley, presenting an 18-hole, 72-par course ready to test every player's mettle. Venture 7 miles east to Wildhorse Resort & Casino Golf Course, where 18 holes of stunning golf await. Designed by legendary architect John Steidel, this course has become a stop to the Epson Tour Road to the LPGA. Choose from four sets of tees spanning 5,718 to 7,128 yards for a golfing experience tailored for you.

HIKING

Wander the **Pendleton River Parkway**, which presents nearly three miles of tranquility along the Umatilla River, guiding you through the heart of Pendleton amidst abundant bird-life. Trek the Pendleton **Adventure Trail Recreation Area**, offering opportunities for hiking, trail running, and mountain biking trails near the airport. Venture into the North Fork Umatilla Wilderness, a designated area in the Umatilla National Forest, where the call of nature resonates. Embark on a journey at Emigrant Springs State Park take I-84 to exit 234 and stroll along the nature trail.



FITNESS

BIRD WATCHING

Along the **Umatilla River Parkway**, witness osprey, kingfishers, and a symphony of avian life. Delve into the **Pendleton Bird Club's** list of 250+ bird species at pendletonbirders.org. At **McKay Creek National Wildlife Refuge**, encounter rare and endangered species amidst the plains and the Blue Mountains.

HUNTING

Discover the wild heart of the **Umatilla National Forest**, a haven for Rocky Mountain elk, mule deer, whitetail deer, and other majestic creatures. **McKay Creek National Wildlife Refuge** opens its doors to hunting geese, ducks, snipe, and upland game birds each fall. Located in Echo, OR, **Horseshoe Curve Outdoors** offers multiple premium lodging options for hunters and retreat seekers. Everything from guided hunting tours, fully prepped meals, or even a more DIY experience can be accommodated.

FISHING

Cast your line into serenity. Steelhead, coho, and Chinook salmon await anglers on the **Umatilla River**. The upper river offers rainbow trout, whitefish, and bull trout. Fall Chinook and coho salmon grace the river from August through December. Venture to **McKay Reservoir** for bullhead catfish, crappie, and other panfish, just 6 miles south of Pendleton on Highway 395.




CHARM TRAIL

The first Pendleton Round-up, held in 1910, was to be "a frontier exhibition of picturesque pastimes, Indian and military spectacles, cowboy racing and bronco busting for the championship of the Northwest." It lived up to expectations, and more. Round-Up has grown into a week-long celebration of Western heritage, thrilling tens of thousands of cowboys and cowgirls (and those who want to be!) every year. Everyone is welcome in Pendleton!

When: Always held the second full week of September.

What: The rodeo goes four afternoons: Wednesday through Saturday, but there is plenty more to do that week: Pro Bull Riding, concerts, parades, dancing, gambling...

Inside you will also find the Northwest Native American Designer Showcase where you can view and purchase authentic handmade apparel and jewelry.


